

In the story Bunting had to keep counting the toys to make sure they were all there. This week you are going to complete some counting games too!

<p>Mrs Rolls has been counting 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 Can you carry on the sequence to 20? Could you even go all the way to 100?</p> 	<p>Go on a hunt around your house and count the number of objects that you find. You could make a list or a chart. For example: 6 chairs 3 beds</p> 	<p>Play the 'Hidden Jewels' with an adult. An adult puts some 'Hidden Jewels' in a bowl without you seeing. They let you have a little look in the bowl. Guess how many 'jewels' are in there and then count them to see if you are correct. Have another go!</p>	<p>Can you dance, sing and count with Jack Hartmann? Dance, sing and count</p> 	<p><u>Problem solving!!</u> Biscuit Decorations (you could do this on actual biscuits!!) Andrew decorated 20 biscuits to take to a party. He lined them up and put icing on every second biscuit. Then he put a cherry on every third biscuit. Then he put a chocolate button on every fourth biscuit. So there was nothing on the first biscuit. How many other biscuits had no decoration? Did any biscuits get all three decorations?</p>

<p><u>Lets Investigate</u></p> <p>In the story, bunting finds himself on a boat floating on the water. Could you make a boat for your toy/ teddy by using materials you can find at home. Why not try reusing a plastic bottle/ pot for your boat? You could use twigs and a plastic bag to make a sail</p> 	<p><u>Physical</u></p> <p>Bunting and his toys friends enjoy playing hide and seek. Can you play a game of hide and seek with your toys? Why not ask a grown up to hide your toys around the house for you to find.</p> 	<p><u>Design and make</u></p> <p>Can you make your own sock puppet? Watch the video and make sure to take a picture of your sock puppet creations!</p> <p>Sock Puppets</p>	<p><u>ICT</u></p> <p>All the toys in the story are in a museum, which means that they could be really old. Research an old toy and then tell a grown up all about it or write about it to tell your friends.</p> 	<p><u>Well-being</u></p> <p>Find your favourite toy and play a game with it, read it a book or just give it a cuddle.</p>
