The Reasons we LOVE our Sandpits!

Our Sand Pits provide so much more than just a place to play! In the sandpits the children will be:



Digging, lifting, squashing, squeezing, pushing and pulling the sand and tools. – vital to develop hand/eye co-ordination and improve fine and gross motor skills, developing the muscles needed to write...

Filling and emptying buckets – vital to develop early Maths concepts such as Volume & Capacity...

Counting – the equipment, the number of children playing, the number of handfuls of sand it takes to fill the bucket, the number of shoes compared to the number of children, the opportunities are endless...

Socialising – working out how many can safely play, talking about their adventures and creations, helping each other to build, dig and bury...

Sharing – the equipment, the space (and hopefully not socks and shoes!!)...

Learning how to take off/put on their socks and shoes (and how to make sure they have the right ones to go home with!

Exploring the properties of sand – developing a love of science and the world around them.

Problem solving things that arise naturally like how can I build a sandcastle without a bucket and those created by teachers!

Being creative – not only with the sand models they build but also by thinking logically and outside of the box...

And you thought they were just having a beach holiday every day!!! SHHHH don't tell them
