Bella was welcomed to the School Council as the representative of the BSL Buddies group.

Members unanimously voted our that school dog Eugene should be part of the school council and presented him with a badge!

1. Matters Arising

- Ethan shared that he had informed the Money Makers of the school charity for the year
- Joshua reported that the WWEs had arranged the Leap into Action Day on 29th February to celebrate the leap year
- Poppy shared that the Eco Warriors will be focussing on Recycling this year
- The Prefect Group are scheduled to meet with Mrs
 Billington this afternoon to discuss Playmaker timetables
 and their legacy

2. Updates from AOLE Chairpersons

Jorgie shared that the Performing Arts Academy had designed the posters to advertise the concerts so far this year and the tickets for sale. They are due to meet in the upcoming weeks to design the adverts and tickets for the Years 3/4 concert. In addition, Jorgie also stated that the group were designing badges for the various roles within the group.

Joshua apologised that he didn't know a lot of what the WWEs had been up to given that he had been on holiday last term. However, he was aware of the Leap into Action Super Learning Day which was very successful.

Rhodri explained that the Criw Cymreig were still very active, collecting sheets from classes and awarding the Ddraig Coch's to those using lots of Welsh throughout the week. He said to further promote more extended language the CC had discussed introducing an extended sentence in each class for the children to use. This is to be introduced this term. Rhodri added that the CC had help arrange, organise and support the St David's Day celebrations across the school.

Ethan shared that the Money Makers have taken responsibility for school snack. They meet on a Monday morning and distribute the fruit and two members will be meeting with Mrs Carver to discuss the costings. Money Makers have also introduced Class Attendance of the Week and award £10 vouchers to the classes with the best attendance. Idwal class have taken the lead so far. The scheme is to promote better attendance across the school.

Poppy explained that the Eco Warriors plan to hold an assembly to launch their Recycling initiative. They have already started to make changes in school such as ensuring food is separated from all other waste at lunchtimes.

Brooke shared that the The Story Squad's library launch was very successful and over 120 children had been treated to a "milkshake and movie" afternoon as a reward for earning 6 or

more stickers. She said that lots of book reviews had been completed and more children are choosing to read at home. The next goal will be for 12 stickers to be earned.

Bella reported that the BSL group had introduced lots of sign language into the school and launched the class token/trophy scheme which is working well. Others commented that lots of children are using sign language across the school and enjoying learning the new skill.

Jaxon and Sophia shared that the Prefect group had also been active, supporting in assemblies, helping in concerts and with parent events and a few members had presented the Governing Body at their latest meeting when three members created and shared a Power Point presentation.

3. School Improvement

Mrs Billington asked for the School Council's opinions on what is working well at school and what we can do to make school even better.

What could improve our school:

School Meals – the council discussed how portion sizes could be bigger the choice improved for vegetarians. A decision was made for the School Council to write to our local councillor, MP and the catering team to share their concerns. They did note that the salad bar was a welcome addition to lunch times.

More competitive sports and clubs — Rhodri and Jaxon asked about football and rugby clubs after school and shared that they would like to take part in more matches throughout the year. Mrs Billington agreed to look into this.

4. Any Other Business

Mrs Billington asked for feedback on assemblies and how these could be improved now we have the new screens in the hall. Following much discussion, it was agreed:

- School Council will run at least one assembly per half term
- Head Boy/Head Girl and deputies will take responsibility for sharing the Lord's Prayer and suggested lighting a candle at reflection time.
- Learn more songs to sing in assembly including Welsh songs using the screens for lyrics and sign language

- Class of the assembly Brooke suggested the class who listens, takes part etc. the most during assembly should be rewarded
- Catch up with Super Star Staff Awards Mrs Billington said 10 awards would be given out this week as we've fallen behind.
