Following careful consideration of all responses and a review of the current policy ,
Governors have agreed that no changes will be made to the current school uniform policy
at this time.

Affordability & Value for Money

The current uniform is designed to keep costs to a minimum, allowing parents to purchase items from a wide range of retailers, including supermarkets.

Consultation responses highlighted that many parents find the uniform cost-effective and accessible.

The option to wear unbranded items already supports affordability and aligns with Welsh Government guidance.

Practicality

The existing uniform supports a highly practical, active school day.

Pupils can participate in PE, outdoor learning, and classroom activities without needing additional kit, reducing both cost and organisational burden. Staff feedback confirms that this approach maximises learning time and flexibility.

Support

A significant proportion of responses supported maintaining the current uniform:

Equal numbers of respondents requested no changes as those suggesting specific amendments.

Many parents specifically asked for key elements to remain, including joggers/leggings and sensible footwear. Comments highlighted that the uniform is comfortable, practical and still smart.

Consistency

Maintaining a clear and consistent policy ensures:

- Ease of understanding for families
- Consistent expectations for pupils
- Smooth day-to-day school operations



Inclusion & Equality

Our uniform has been carefully designed to be inclusive:

Comfortable options such as joggers and leggings support pupils with sensory needs. A consistent approach helps ensure equity, removing pressure linked to fashion or specific clothing expectations.

The policy has been equality impact assessed and complies with the Equality Act 2010 .

Governors recognise the merit of the suggestion to introduce sew-on or iron-on badges, particularly in relation to:

- Increasing flexibility in sourcing uniform items
- Further supporting cost reduction for families
- Aligning with Welsh Government guidance regarding access to a wider range of suppliers

We will now make enquiries into this option and will update parents in due course.



The Governing Body remains committed to ensuring that our school uniform:

- Reflects the values and ethos of Park CP
- Is inclusive, practical and affordable
- Supports high standards without placing unnecessary burden on families

We will continue to review the policy at appropriate intervals and welcome ongoing feedback.
